

Dr. Christine Bergan, Director of the Ottumwa Area Community Chorus

Dr. Christine Bergan was selected to be the new director of the Ottumwa Area Community Chorus in February, 2016. Christine is an Ottumwa native, and is the daughter of Dick Carroll and the late Pat Carroll, mother to Brooke (Bergan) Lim and Bradley Bergan, and sister to Steve and Kevin Carroll and Kim (Carroll) Heckart.

Dr. Bergan holds a Ph.D. in Voice Science from University of Iowa, a Master's Degree in Vocal Performance from University of Northern Iowa, and a Master's Degree in Speech and Language Pathology, also from the University of Iowa; as well as a bachelor's degree in Music Education from Evangel University, with a major in voice and minor in piano, leading to double certification to teach both K-12 vocal and instrumental music, which she did for 8 years in the public schools in Iowa and Missouri. All three graduate degrees include an emphasis on vocal pedagogy, or is knowledge of how to teach healthy voice production as well as how to rehabilitate voices suffering from a myriad of pathologic conditions and injuries.

Dr. Bergan has over thirty years of experience as a professional vocalist and vocal instructor, and ten years of experience as a choral director in both middle schools and high schools and church settings. Her professional vocalist experiences include performing with the St. Louis Symphony Chorus, the Southeast Iowa Symphony, the Ottumwa Symphony, the Chamber Singers of Iowa City, Swing Street Big Band in Iowa City, and in Carnegie Hall.

Dr. Bergan has seven years of experience as an assistant professor and three years of experience as a program director/chair in Speech and Language Pathology and Audiology programs at universities in both Illinois and Texas. She is currently working as a Speech and Language Pathologist for the Great Prairie Area Education Agency; and also does occasional clinical work in medical settings for regional rehabilitation companies. She is enjoying working with the many students and patients she sees, who represent ages across the life-span.

Cheryl Miller, Accompanist for Ottumwa Area Community Chorus


Cheryl Miller earned a Bachelor of Music degree in piano performance from Truman University where she was a student of Frederic Kirchberger. At the University of Iowa, she studied with William Doppmann and Kenneth Amada. Southeast Iowa Symphony artists -in- residence she has accompanied include violinist Robert McDuffie, trumpeter Stephen Burns, baritone Chris Nomura, and violinist Chee-Yun. Together with Virginia Schmucker, she presented several duo-piano recitals in Ottumwa. She has also played with the Truman University Orchestra, the Southeast Iowa Symphony, and the Ottumwa Symphony. She is the founding member of the Encore Piano Trio along with Charlene Hansen and Wendy Bittner.

Mrs. Miller began teaching piano as a college freshman, and also taught instrumental music (strings) in the Ottumwa Community Schools. She currently teaches piano in her private studio and has taught at Indian Hills Community College and Hannibal-LaGrange College. Three of her students have been winners of the Ottumwa Symphony and Southeast Iowa Young Artists competitions.

In addition to her musical activities, Mrs. Miller is an avid flower gardener and a member of Laureate Guild, book club, Art Club and Fortnightly. She is currently studying pipe organ with Carl Moehlman in Mt. Pleasant. She and her husband, Steve, are the proud parents of two children and two wonderful grandchildren.

Andrew Lloyd Webber

Andrew Lloyd Webber, Baron Lloyd-Webber (born March 22, 1948) is an English composer and impresario of musical theatre. Several of his musicals have run for more than a decade, both in the West End and on Broadway. He has composed 13 musicals, a song cycle, a set of variations, two film scores, and a Latin Requiem Mass. Several of his songs have been widely recorded and were hits outside of their originating musicals, notably "The Music of the Night" from *The Phantom of the Opera*, "I Don't Know How to Love Him" from *Jesus Christ Superstar*, "Don't Cry for Me, Argentina," and "You Must Love Me" from *Evita*, "Any Dream Will Do" from *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*, and "Memory" from *Cats*. In 2001 the New York Times referred to him as "the most commercially successful composer in history."



He has received a number of awards, including a knighthood in 1992, followed by a peerage from Queen Elizabeth II for services to Music, seven Tonys, three Grammys (as well as the Grammy Legend Award), an Academy Award, fourteen Ivor Novello Awards, seven Olivier Awards, a Golden Globe, a Brit Award, the 2006 Kennedy Center Honors, and the 2008 Classic Brit Award for Outstanding Contribution to Music. He has a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, is an inductee into the Songwriter's Hall of Fame, and is a fellow of the Brit-ish Academy of Songwriters, Composers, and Authors.

His company, the "Really Useful Group," is one of the largest theatre operators in London. Producers in several parts of the UK have staged productions, including national tours, of the Lloyd Webber musicals under license from the Really Useful Group. Andrew Lloyd Webber is also the president of the Arts Educational Schools London, a performing arts school located in Chiswick, West London. He is involved in a number of charitable activities, including the Elton John AIDS Foundation, Nordoff Robbins, Prostate Cancer UK, and War Child. In 1992 he set up the Andrew Lloyd Webber Foundation which supports the arts, culture, and heritage in the UK.

Since the passing of the baton to Dr. Christine Bergan in February, 2016, the OACC has performed in the recent American Gothic Performing Arts Festival's production of the concert version of "The Music Man" (as the townspeople) in June, 2016, and with the Ottumwa Municipal Band for "The Battle Hymn of the Republic" and "America the Beautiful" in July, 2016.
